- Is a joint initiative of the EU, International Financial Institutions, bilateral donors and the governments of the Western Balkans.




WBIF Highlights

- > €10 billion total investment




Grants by Beneficiary




Project cycle process

National Highlights

- 8 projects (6 national + 2 regional)
- Grant value: national €3.78 million
- Regional €5.08 million
- Total €8.86million
- €800 million total investment







Construction of a new penitentiary and prison complex in Šibenik





- New prison complex for 1270 inmates
- Design will follow EU best practices and take full environmental due care
- WBIF support: Operational Plan and Feasibility Report (2011); Preparation of tender documentation for D&B and supervision contracts, support in procurement, design review (2012 - 2013)
- Estimated investment €100m
- Project partners: Ministry of Justice Prison System

LNG Regasification Vessel

- Provision of a LNG storage and regasification management system to diversify Croatia's source of natural gas
- Providing gas for domestic and international markets to Western Balkans and Central & Western Europe via the Central European Gas Hub in Baumgarten, Austria
- WBIF support: Concept Options; Feasibility Study; EIS and SIA; Conceptual Design for Location permit (studies start 2012)
- Estimated investment: €101m
- Project partners: Plinacro | EBRD







LNG Evacuation Pipeline, Omišalj-Zlobin-Rupa




- New gas pipeline transmitting LNG gas from Omišalj on island of Krk to Slovenian border
- Supplying domestic markets and international, via
 Slovenia, to Central Europe and Italy
- WBIF support: Feasibility Study review; Cost-Benefit Analysis (studies start 2012)
- Estimated investment €95.7m
- Project partners: Plinacro | EBRD



New Campus and University of Zadar Learning & Resource Centre


- Expanding facilities at the University of Zadar
- Conversion of existing buildings and new construction to provide student accommodation and a Learning & Resource Centre.
- WBIF support: Feasibility Study; EIA; Conceptual Design (studies start 2012)
- Estimated investment €90.5m
- Project partners: University of Zadar | EIB







Regional Project: Ionian Adriatic Pipeline





- A new gas pipeline to interconnect existing and planned transmission pipes
- Alternative additional supply route from Middle East and Caspian region. Bi-directional for maximum flexibility
- Regionally important providing gas to Albania,
 Montenegro, Bosnia I Herzegovina and southern Croatia
- WBIF support: Feasibility Study; EIA & SIA (studies start 2012)
- Estimated investment €583.5m
 - Project partners: Plinacro | EBRD



Regional Project: South East Europe Centre for Entrepreneurial Learning - SEECEL

- Construction of facilities for SEECEL for wider Western Balkans' benefit. SEECEL is dedicated to furthering excellence in entrepreneurial development
- New entrepreneurial education, conference and accommodation facilities will be created mainly for international students
- WBIF support: Feasibility Study; EIA; Design; Support with Tendering (studies start 2012)
- Estimated investment €30m
- Project partners: SEECEL | EIB
